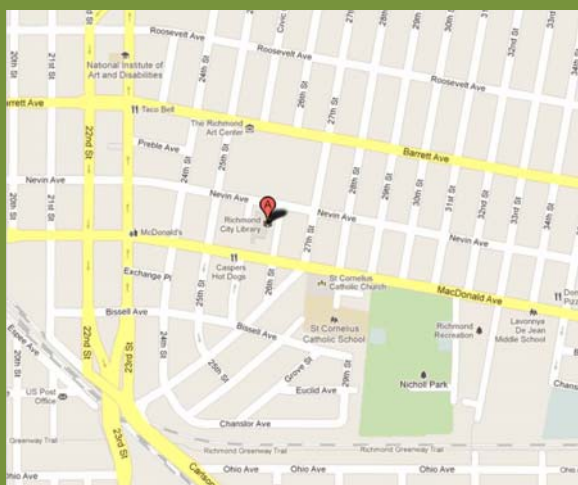

The Bay Trail Connection to Point Molate is a planned multi-use trail that will provide non-motorized access from Richmond to Point Molate. The Trail will close a roughly one-mile gap in the San Francisco Bay Trail, a Planned 500-mile trail circling San Francisco Bay (www.baytrail.org), with a planned future connection to Marin County. The goal of the project is to provide an off-street route to Point Molate that is safe, continuous and accessible for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This public meeting will review several project alternatives that have been developed and evaluated based constraints and design criteria and public input obtained during the January 2011 Community Workshop.
